THINGS TO DO BEFORE GOING ABROAD



There are several formalities you must do before you can board the plane and start your study abroad journey. Your preparation will go smoothly if you start thinking about the things you need earlier. This list will help you consider some of the things you will have to do.

OBTAINING VISA

You must have a valid passport for six months beyond your arrival date. International students can get an application visa from the Egyptian embassy or consulate from their home country for 30 days. North American, European, British and Australian citizens can get a visa upon arrival at Cairo International Airport valid for one month for USD \$25.

After your arrival in Egypt and have deposited your tuition fee, the admission office will provide you a hard copy Letter of Enrollment in order to apply for a student residency in Egypt valid for one year. Once you receive the Letter of Enrollment, sign up at the International Program Office to receive an email with the exact details for your appointment at the immigration process. There will be a person who will guide you through the process.

Note: Do not wait until the last minute to apply for a visa. Allow several weeks if you are getting the visa by email.

TRAVEL REGULATION

Before departing from your home country, you are responsible to keep yourself informed of all travel regulations and COVID-19 safety measures. As of 17 June 2022, Egypt has lifted all COVID-19 restrictions on travelers coming to Egypt. You no longer need to take a PCR test or show proof of vaccination.

However, this does not mean that you should stop frequently checking updates regarding travel safety advise and restrictions. People coming from countries of high risk for yellow fever such as Brazil, Ecuador, Venezuela, or Sudan, must show their yellow fever vaccination certificate in order to enter Egypt.



IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS

International student and Egyptian nationals living abroad must have all their important documents, such as high school transcript, proof of 12 years of schooling, and any original certificates (i.e. WAEC, KCSE, etc.) to be authenticated by their home country's foreign affairs before arriving in Egypt.

To know more on document requirements, please contact the admission office of your chosen university: University of Prince Edward Island Cairo Campus (UPEI Cairo) or Toronto Metropolitan University Cairo Campus (TMU Cairo).

In order to receive a hard copy Letter of Enrollment from the admission office to submit for a student residency in Egypt, you must have all the above-mentioned documents authenticated by your home country's foreign affairs, English proficiency certificate, COVID-19 vaccination certificate, original birth certificate and a copy of \$1,500 USD non-refundable tuition deposit receipt. Before you start the process of having your documents authenticated, consult with your home countries' foreign affairs to know what the requirements for authentication.

Note: If your documents are in a language other than English, you must provide the documents in the original language as well as a certified/notarized literal English translation.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY TEST

It is always best to take the English language proficiency test months in advance before you arrive in Egypt. Even if you have submitted your proof of English language proficiency online, you must bring the original certificate with you when you come to UofCanada campus. The admissions office will request to see the English proficiency certificate for verification.



The English proficiency tests that UPEI Cairo and Ryerson Cairo accept are TOEFL, IELTS, and Pearson Test of English. HEALTH INSURANCE

Egypt doesn't require foreign visitors to get a health insurance prior their arrival to the country. However, students enrolling to UofCanada's hosted universities are obligated to pay the health insurance fee that is an addition to the university tuition fee annually.


CURRENCY

Egypt's national currency is Egyptian Pounds. Currency exchanges are conveniently located in almost every hotel and airport, and banks are easily accessible throughout the national via a quick Google search.

A maximum of 5,000 Egyptian Pounds in local currency and about \$10,000 (or its equivalent) in foreign cash can be brought into or taken out of the country, provided that it was disclosed on arrival or departure. To know more about custom regulation in Egypt, please visit cairo-airport.com/en-us/

Before you arrive in Egypt, make sure with your bank (from your home country) that it allows you to make transactions through your credit card in Egypt.

Note: Do not withdraw money from ATMs in Egypt using your home country credit card because you will be charged a fee. Bring enough cash with you, before you board your flight.

TRANSPORTATION

UofCanada provides bus pick up from the airport (with additional fees). You must notify the International Program Office when your arrival to Egypt is to arrange a bus to come pick you up.

The best and safest form of transportation to use in Egypt is Uber or any mobility service provider used in Egypt. They screen their drivers, and you get charged through the application (not from the driver). You can choose through the app which method of payment you want to pay.

SIM CARD

There are various types of telecommunication companies you can choose from to purchase a sim number in Egypt. Some of the well-known telecommunication companies in Egypt are Etisalat, Orange and Vodafone. You can find these stores anywhere. All you have to bring is your passport, visa and your credit card or cash.

BANKING

International students can open a bank account in Egypt after they have lived for six months (some banks request it). In order to open a bank account, you need to have:

- A valid passport
- Resident permit
- Must be 21 years old
- Passport size photo
- Minimum deposit (amount needed will depend on the bank)
- A completed (and signed) application form

In many cases, you will need to bring supporting documents such as:

Proof of student status (Confirmation of Enrollment letter)

- Proof of residence (student residency or rental contract)
 You might be charged a fee to open a bank account in Egypt. Some
 of the suitable banks in Egypt that you might consider opening with
 are:
- Arab Bank Egypt
- HSBC Egypt
- Emirates NBD

SAFETY TIPS

- Leave extra cash and valuables in a secure location and avoid carrying your credit card, tickets, and cash with you when you go out.
- Avoid using ATMs in isolated or dimly lit areas and refrain from displaying big sums of cash in public.
- Unless absolutely necessary, don't bring your passport outside; instead, maintain a copy of your residency stamp.
- Give your family or friends a copy of your passport and proof of residency.
- In public locations like internet cafes, train stations, and bus stops, keep a tight check on your personal goods and hang onto them.
- Never drink tap water and always drink tap water bottles.
 Nestle is a good company for drinkable water.
- Refrain from taking public microbuses to get around
 Cairo. The use of these vehicles is unregulated.

CAMPUS



UofCanada isn't just an education, but an experience. Students' majority of their time is not only spent inside the classroom but also outside. UofCanada has many services and facilities offered to their students to not only help them in their academic journey but also have a great time as UofCanada students..

ACCOMMODATION

UofCanada provides student residence to international students, which are fully furnished apartments that has 3 to 4 rooms, divided between single and double room options. To know more about the application processes and rates, please visit

BUSES

UofCanada has buses that pickup and drop off students from their dorms to the campus. Buses typically leave from 1:30 pm (arrives on campus at 1 pm) and from 4:15 pm (arrives on campus at 4 pm). Once you pay the bus fee, you will receive information directly to your student email account about which buses to ride and where the check point to be picked up at. Students residing in the dorms receive 25% discount on their bus fee.

ORIENTATION

International students are required to attend the Orientation session which is held a week before classes begin. This is the best time for international students to get acquainted with the new culture, meet new people, tour the campus and have the opportunity to ask questions.



COVID-19 SAFETY

UofCanada follows WHO's COVID-19 safety measurement inside the campus. Students must follow all COVID-19 safety measurements by wearing masks inside the bus and on campus, disinfecting hands before touching any surfaces, and keeping a 2 meters distance. There are sanitizers available all-around campus for students and staff to keep their hands sanitized.

FIRST AID CLINIC

There is a First Aid Clinic located in building B that provides first aid support, medical advice by a professional physician, and medical check-up for students enrolled in athletic programs.

There is also a small pharmacy for general drugs. In terms of critical cases, students will be transferred to the International Medical Center.

INTERNATIONAL PEER LEADERS PROGRAM

The mission of this program is to match UofCanada international students with incoming international students to help them transition easily to Cairo and to the University. International students will receive peer support and friendship from their international peer leaders.

STUDENT UNION

The Student Union (SU) is there to represent all students and support their rights and responsibilities. The Student Union performs while adhering to all university rules and regulations. Each SU presidency serves for one academic year.
